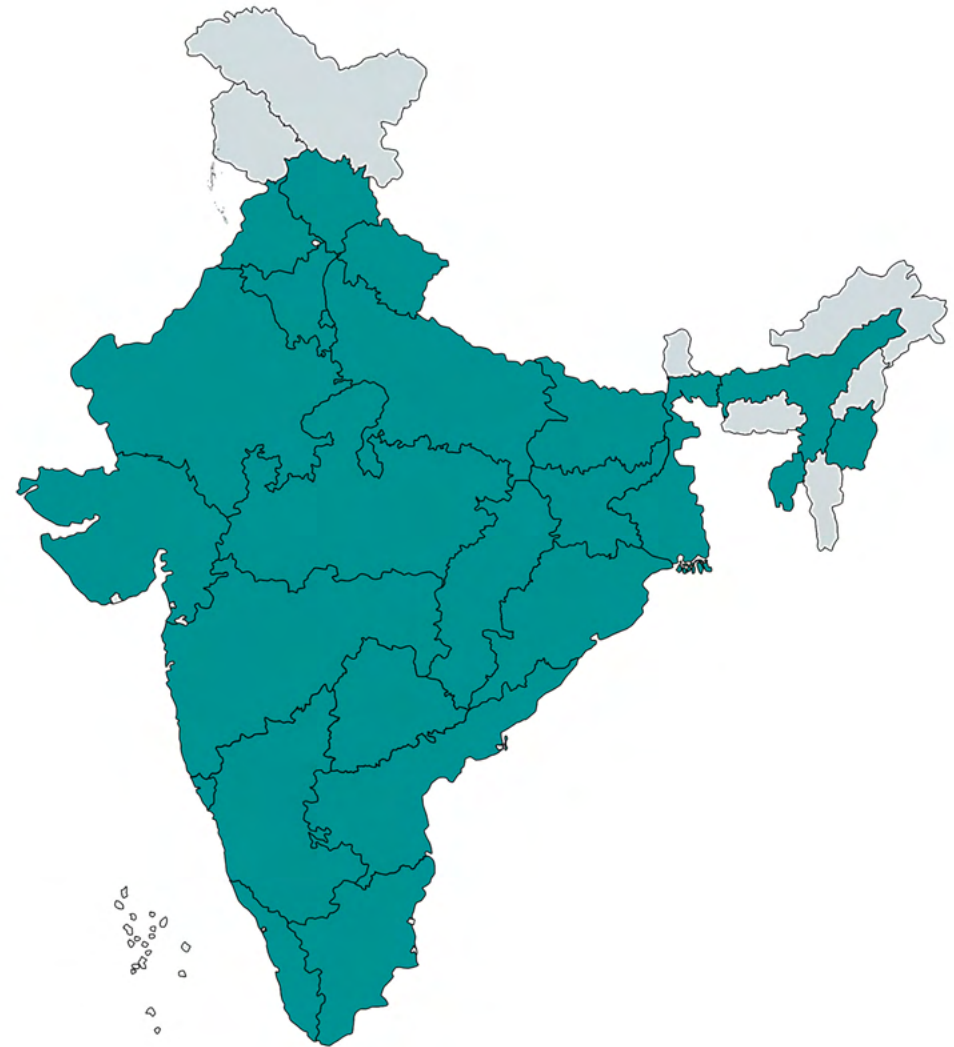

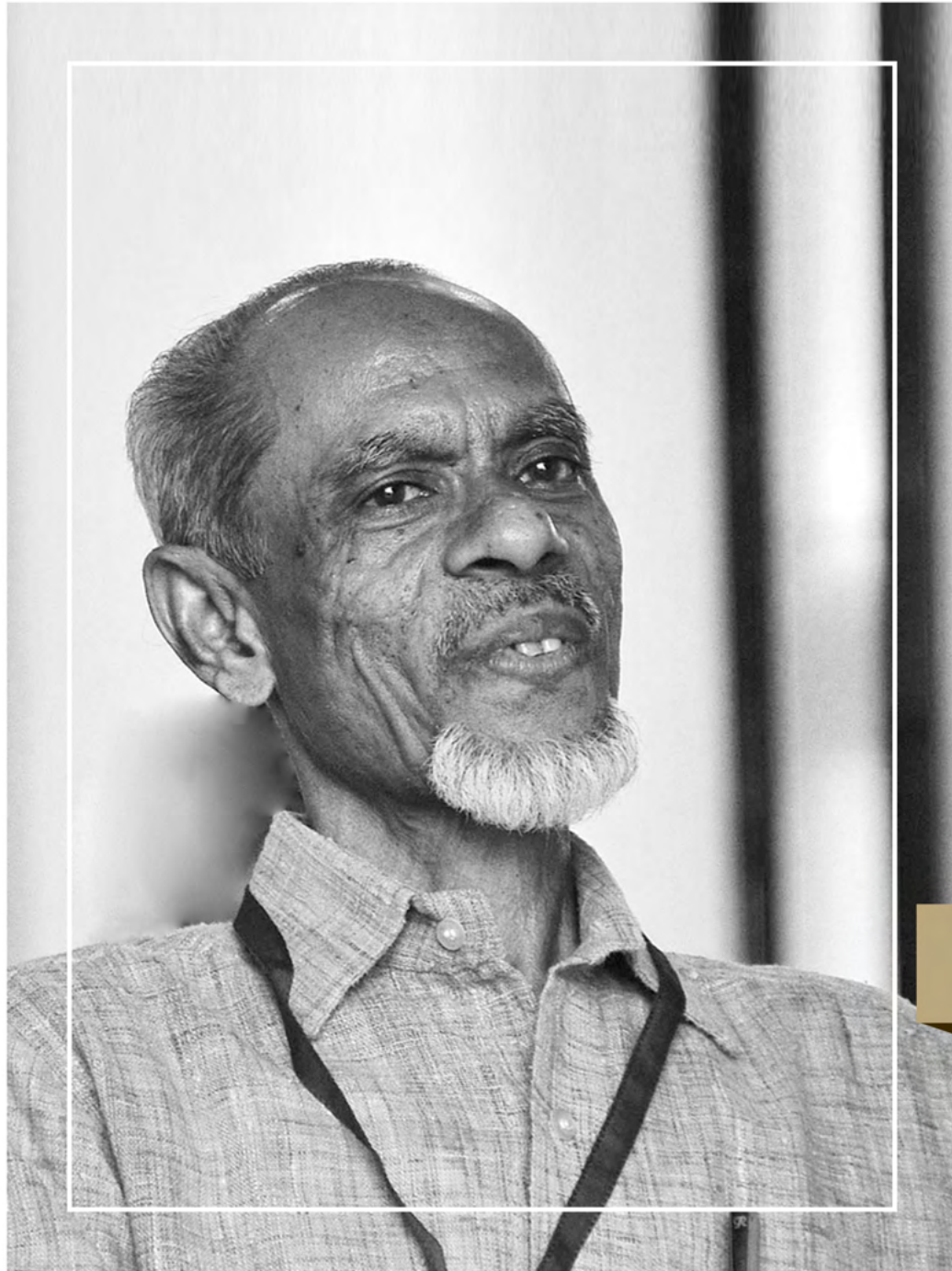

CTAG

WBCS RESIDENTIAL COACHING CENTRE IN KOLKATA

WBCS Coaching Program is a promising project initiated by Vision under CTAG. The program aims at providing residential and free coaching for West Bengal Civil Service. Under the program, we started a residential coaching centre in Kolkata, West Bengal. In 2023, 18 students are studying in the centre.. Students are selected through a rigorous process of entrance examinations.

This is the first of its kind as the organization is planning to set up such centres in other underperforming districts as well. WBCS is the state administrative civil service cadre of the Indian state of West Bengal. The competitive exam for the same is conducted every year by the Public Service Commission of West Bengal- PSCWB.

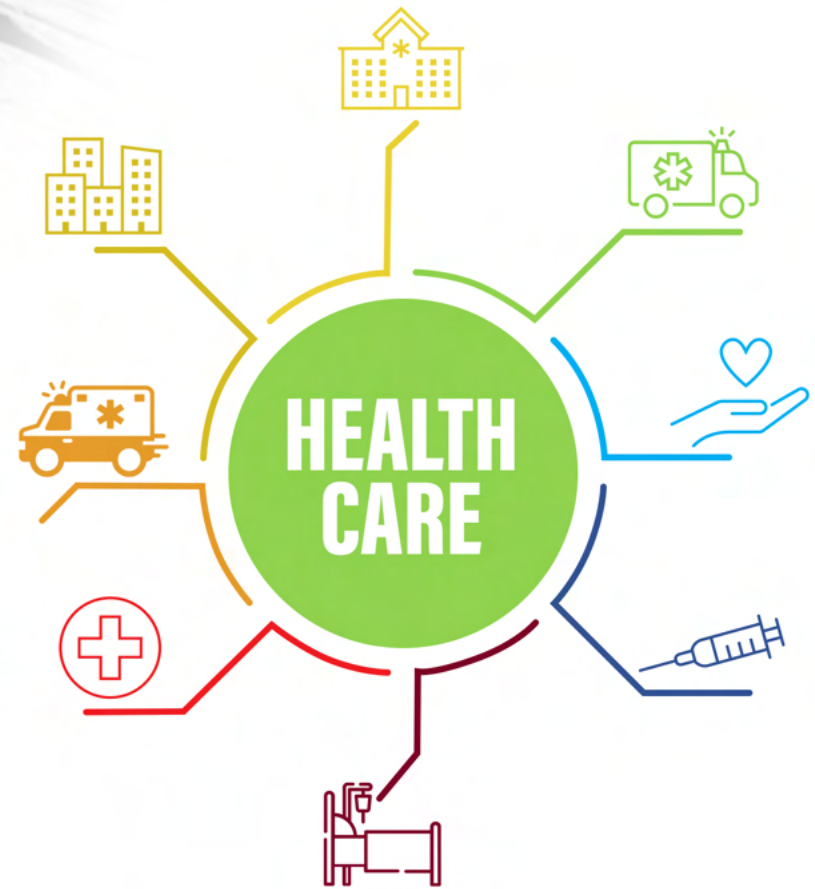

AL SHIFA MULTISPECIALTY HOSPITAL, NEW DELHI

Al Shifa Multispecialty Hospital facilitates around 20 departments including diagnostic centres with a total number of 340+ qualified staff. In collaboration with the Govt. of Delhi, Al Shifa is also running a free vaccination centre. In 2023, around 1,50,281 people were the beneficiaries of the hospital services. Rs. 44,79,087 was spent by Al Shifa for free/charitable services. Free medicines worth Rs. 39,97,940/ on MRP were dispensed to the beneficiaries through the mobile medical van program.

By equipping participants with these vital skills, the workshop contributes significantly to building a more resilient and prepared community.

The Human Welfare Foundation Commemorated World Cancer Day (Feb 4) by orchestrating a series of impactful programs aimed at fostering awareness regarding the disease. These initiatives encompassed enlightening awareness talks delivered by esteemed experts in the field of oncology, addressing audiences comprising students, educators, and members of the community. The purpose of these events was to disseminate the critical message of cancer awareness throughout seven states across the nation, namely Assam, Bihar, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, U.P, and West Bengal.

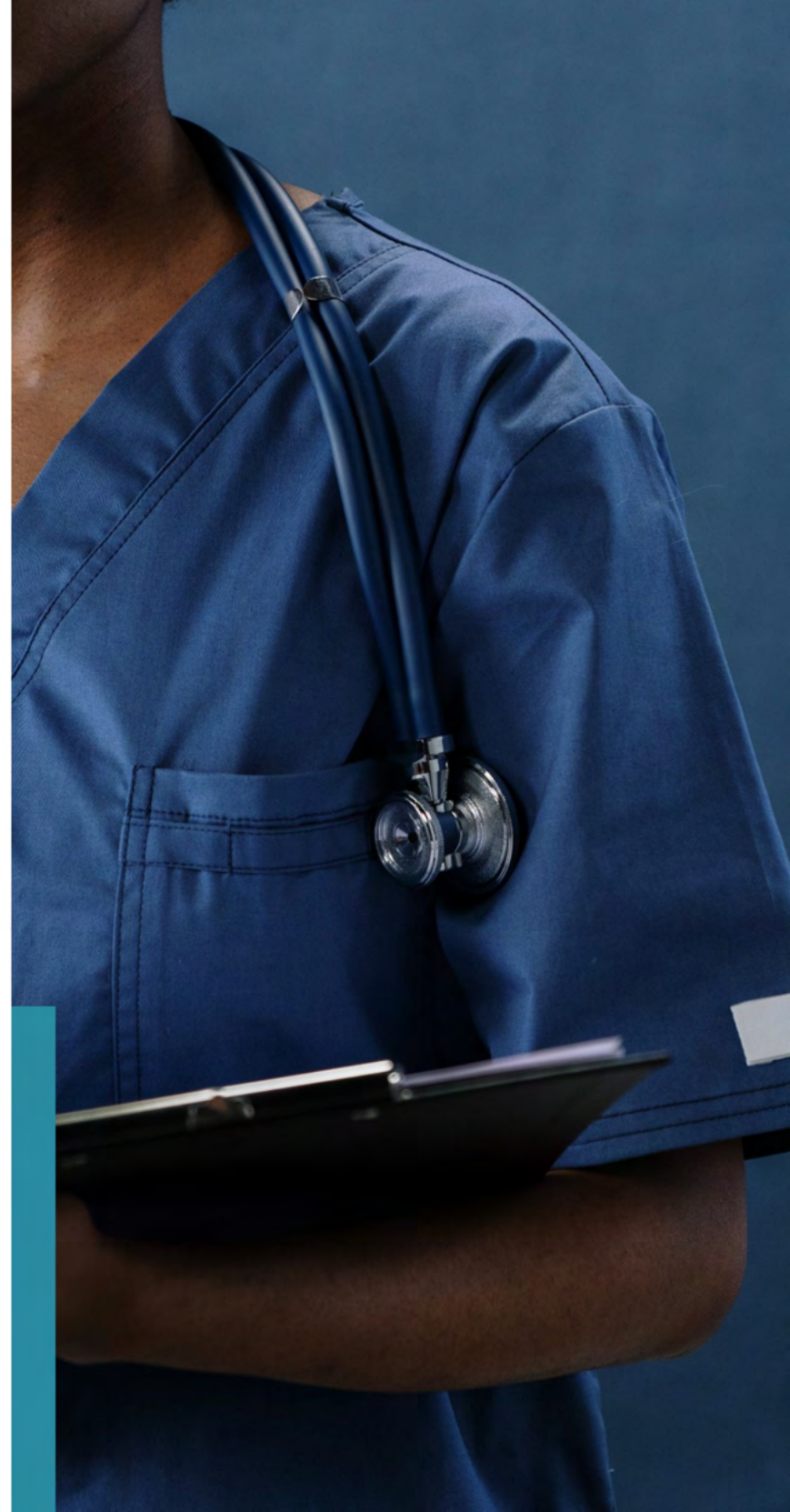


Free Measles and Rubella Vaccination Camp

A Free Measles and Rubella Vaccination Camp was organised at Al-Shifa Hospital, New Delhi a total of 95 children were vaccinated. This is a significant effort in promoting public health and ensuring that children receive proper vaccination and care, especially amidst the current health situation of rising measles cases in the area.

Free Health Screening Camp for Children with Special Needs

A Free Health Screening Camp for Children with Special Needs was conducted at Al-Shifa Hospital, New Delhi. The event aimed to provide comprehensive healthcare services to 103 children aged 2 to 18 with multiple disabilities. A team of medical professionals, including physiotherapists, educators, and specialists, addressed the unique healthcare needs of the children. Distinguished guests from academia and the government's education department, who overcame disabilities, inspired the participants, creating a positive and uplifting atmosphere.

MEDICAL SERVICE SOCIETY (MSS)

MSS was established to work in the field of healthcare with an emphasis on professional and ethical practices. It operates with partner organizations during man-made and natural calamities to cater to the emergency needs of the victims.



CPR TRAINING PROGRAM:

MSS conducted a CPR training program on October 26, 2023, at IISR in Abul Fazal Enclave, Jamia Nagar. Dr. Moti Lal, a General Surgeon from Al-Shifa Multispecialty Hospital, served as the resource person, guiding 40 students through the training. The participants learned valuable skills such as CPR, first-aid, fracture management, choking response, and burn treatment. Certificates were distributed to all participants at the end of the workshop. The knowledge gained will help them handle emergency situations and potentially save lives in their community.



NAGPUR FLOOD RELIEF:

Responding to severe flooding in Nagpur, Maharashtra, caused by heavy rains and affecting at least 700 people, MSS initiated a multifaceted relief effort. This included a dedicated medical camp, aid for immediate food and shelter needs, and the establishment of a Medical Guidance Center to provide ongoing support and advice.

MEDICAL CAMPS:

The Medical Service Society (MSS), in collaboration with Al-Shifa Hospital, organized three impactful free medical camps in diverse locations, extending crucial healthcare services to communities in need. The first camp in Faridabad, Haryana, featured general check-ups, consultations, and health education, benefiting 231 individuals. In Abul Fazal Enclave, Jamia Nagar, New Delhi, the second camp provided consultations, diagnostic tests, and free medicines to 368 beneficiaries, including school students and staff. The third camp at Tasmia Junior High School in Muzaffarnagar, Uttar Pradesh, focused on children, conducting comprehensive health examinations for over 270 individuals.



HEALTH AWARENESS CAMPS:

MSS organized two health awareness camps in different districts of West Bengal. In Murshidabad, the camp addressed topics such as women's health, sugar, cholesterol, thyroid, and TB, with a special focus on health awareness. Meanwhile, the Howrah District camp covered concerns like dengue fever, obstetrics, women's diseases, and diabetes. Both events featured distinguished speakers from various medical fields, contributing valuable insights.

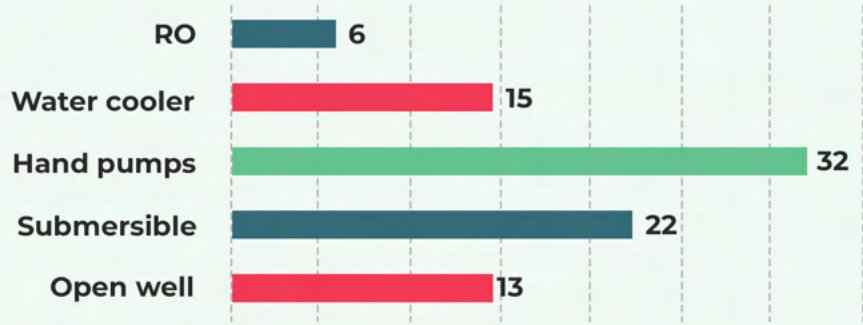

India ranked 111 out of 125 countries in the Global Hunger Index 2023. This also marks a fall from the previous year's rank of 107. This indicates a hunger severity level of 'serious' for the country. Poverty is a major hindrance to the growth of any society. Keeping this in mind, Vision implements the Hunger Relief Program helping thousands of people fight hunger.

Under the program, we provide food kits to the neediest twice a year. In 2023, we could reach 1,77,000 families in 21 states of the country. We also distribute cooked food packets daily through our community kitchens under the project called 'Project Ehsas'.

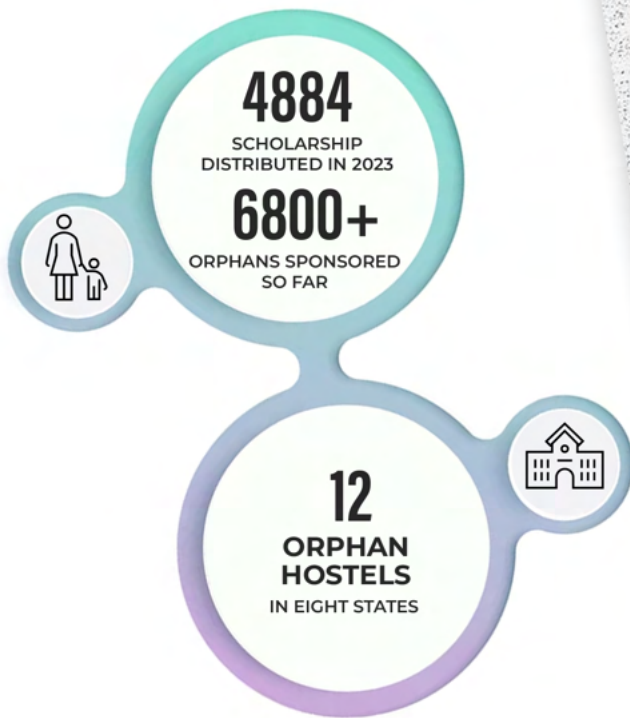


PROJECT EHSAS

The project is to serve the cooked meal to the needy and downtrodden through community kitchens and was initiated in the wake of the worsening hunger crisis due to the Covid- 19 induced lockdowns and consequent loss of jobs in India. Currently, we are running four community kitchens in Delhi, Kolkata, Lucknow, and Mumbai. Under the program, in 2023, we distributed more than 1,78,250+ food packets.

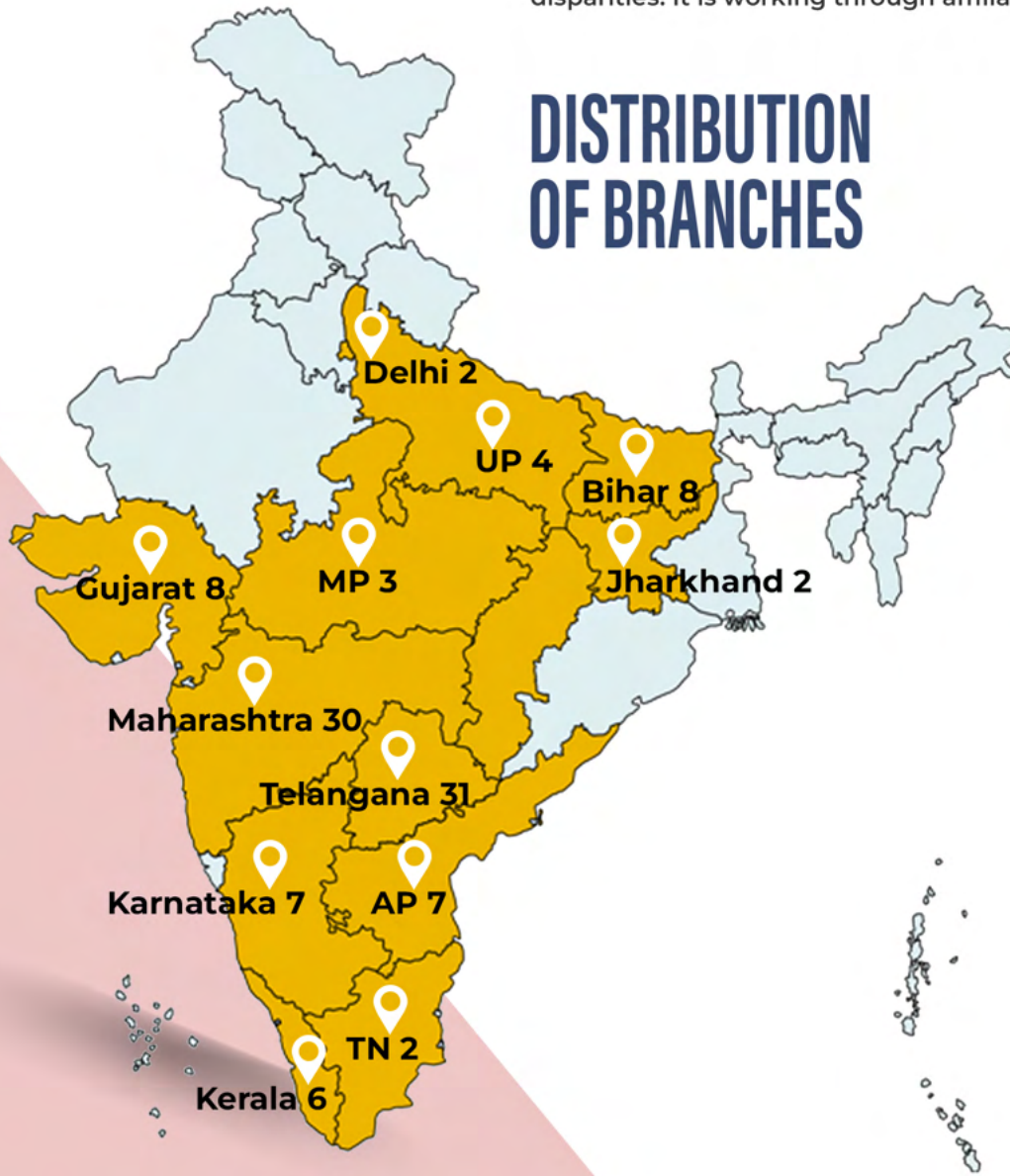

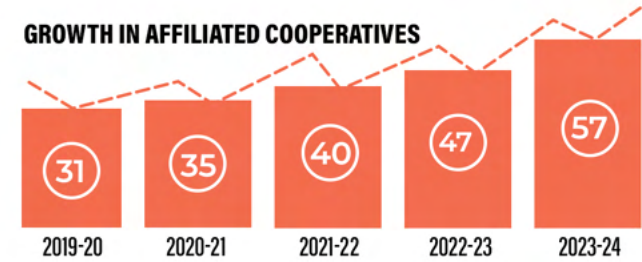
DISTRIBUTION OF BRANCHES



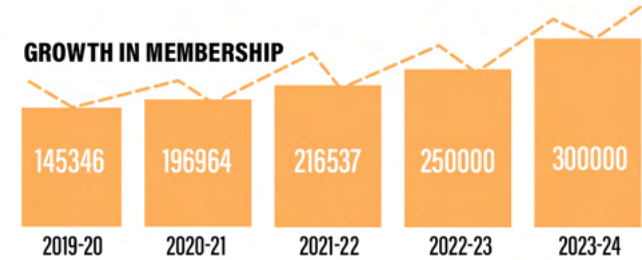
GROWTH IN BRANCHES
