Inauguration of Vision Academic City

The Human Welfare Foundation (HWF) has inaugurated the **Vision Academic City**, a 24-acre educational and social development hub in Marora village, Nuh district. This landmark initiative, under the **Vision 2026 Programme**, marks a historic step toward transforming Mewat—one of Haryana's most underdeveloped regions—by providing quality education, healthcare, and community services.

The project was formally inaugurated by **P. Mohammed Ali Gulfar**, Patron of HWF and Founder of the Gulfar Group. Reflecting on

the initiative, he said: "The dream of Vision 2026 was conceived in 2005 to uplift backward regions like Mewat. Today, that dream is becoming a reality, and we will continue striving for the educational and social progress of this region."

The occasion also witnessed the formal opening of **UG College Building**, **Chirag Middle School** (affiliated with the Haryana Education Board), and separate hostels for boys and girls. Additionally, the foundation stones were laid for **The Scholar School** and a **Skill Development Centre**.

The event also honored the schools' **outstanding alumni**, who are now pursuing higher education, serving as role models for the younger generation.

Visitors relished traditional dishes and interacted with local women managing the kitchen, showcasing both Mewat's culinary richness and its spirit of women's empowerment.

Welfare Foundation (HWF) has significantly scaled up its School Kit Distribution Program this quarter. about 1800 school kits—each containing essential learning materials such as notebooks, pens, and school bags—were distributed to children from economically weaker backgrounds across North India.

The initiative, which began as a response to rising enrolment but persistent poverty-driven barriers to education, aims to **encourage regular school attendance and reduce dropout rates**. This quarter's distribution reached children in urban slums and remote villages of Assam, Bihar, Jharkhand. MP, Odisha, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal, and other underserved regions.



Empowering Educators: Residential Training for 260 Teachers in Northeast India

The Human Welfare Foundation (HWF), in collaboration with the Assam Falah Society, successfully organized a Two-Day Residential Teachers' Training Workshop on 15 July 2025 at HOMA Howley, Guwahati, Assam. The program was specially designed to empower private school teachers across the Northeast region with enhanced leadership and classroom management skills.

The workshop focused on the importance of

strengthening management practices to improve both teaching quality and overall educational outcomes. Through interactive sessions, teachers were encouraged to adopt innovative methods for student engagement and to cultivate inclusive learning environments.

A remarkable **260 teachers from 63 schools** participated in this intensive training, reflecting the strong demand for professional development opportunities in the region.





TSS Guwahati Shines at CBSE Cluster Sports Meet

Two students of The Scholar School (TSS), Guwahati, proudly represented their institution at the CBSE Cluster Sports Meet 2025–26. Farhan Khan competed in the athletics events, showcasing determination and team spirit, while Lunminlem Singson brought laurels to the school by winning the Gold Medal in Shot Put (Under-14 category).

Lunminlem's exceptional performance not only earned him the top position but also secured his qualification for the upcoming CBSE National Sports Meet 2025–26. His achievement reflects the hard work, discipline, and dedication nurtured at TSS, where sports and academics go hand in hand to ensure holistic development.

Raftaar Scholarship: A Renewed Commitment to Orphan Students

The Human Welfare Foundation has reintroduced its **Orphan Care Scholarship** under a new name – **Raftaar Scholarship** – symbolizing speed, progress, and hope for the future. While the name has changed, the mission remains the same: to accelerate educational opportunities for the most deserving orphan and fatherless children, especially from the remotest parts of India.

In this quarter, HWF has extended support to **over 600 students across four states**, ensuring that financial barriers do not block their path to learning. We are also delighted to share that **more than 50 Raftaar scholars have successfully completed their schooling and transitioned to college**, stepping into a new chapter of their academic journeys.





Scholar Spotlight: Md. Nayem's Journey

Hailing from a small village in **Malda, West Bengal**, Md. Nayem joined HWF's Orphan Care Scholarship program (now Raftaar Scholarship) when he was in **Class 6**. With years of consistent support, counseling, and guidance, he successfully completed his schooling. Today, his hard work has borne fruit—**Nayem has secured admission in B.P.T.** (Physiotherapy) at Calcutta Government Medical College through **NEET**.

HWF Free Medical Camp Brings Relief to Hundreds in Rampur

The Human Welfare Foundation organized a large-scale free medical camp in Rampur, Uttar Pradesh, which successfully served 655 beneficiaries. The initiative aimed to provide accessible healthcare services to underprivileged communities and was widely praised for its impactful outreach.

The camp was inaugurated in the presence of the Hon'ble Member of Parliament from Rampur, Mr. Mohibullah Nadvi, who commended the Foundation's efforts, interacted warmly with attendees, and assured his continued support for similar initiatives in the future. Mr. Muhammad Arif, Senior Manager from the Health Department, also graced the occasion and extended his encouragement.

A dedicated medical team from Sankalp Hospital, Bareilly, comprising an oncologist, neurosurgeon, urologist, general physician, and ophthalmologist, provided consultations to patients. Alongside medical advice, free medicines and ECG services were made available to participants.





Nagrik Vikas Kendras: Connecting Communities to Govt. Welfare Schemes

The Human Welfare Foundation's **Nagrik Vikas Kendras (NVKs)**, also known as Government Schemes Facilitation Centres, continue to bridge the gap between marginalized citizens and government welfare schemes. Spread across 12 states, these centres play a pivotal role in guiding people through complex processes and ensuring they receive the benefits they are entitled to. In the last quarter alone, thousands of beneficiaries availed services of NVKs, each story reflecting the life-changing impact of timely support.



In Radhna, Meerut, 60-year-old Shahid Ali found stability in his senior years through NVK's dedicated assistance. With their support, he secured his regular oldage pension and received 17 instalments (₹34,000) under the PM-KISAN scheme. For him, this financial lifeline has been nothing short of a blessing.



Meanwhile, in Jamujharna, Jharkhand, the NVK helped Mrs. Rinki Pahadin access ₹2,39,000 under the JANMAN Awas Yojna. Having already received ₹1,80,000, her family's new home has progressed to roof level, marking a transformative step toward a secure future.

These stories highlight how NVKs are not just service centres but **agents of dignity, stability, and empowerment**, enabling citizens to lead better, more secure lives.

Logo Unveiled for LeadHERship 2025 – National Women NGO Conclave

The Women Education and Empowerment Trust (TWEET), in collaboration with Jamia Hamdard, unveiled the logo of *LeadHERship 2025 – National Women NGO Conclave* at the office of the Vice Chancellor, Jamia Hamdard. The ceremony was graced by Professor Afshar Alam, Vice Chancellor, along with Rahamathunnisa A, Chairperson-TWEET; Professor Reshma Nasreen; Professor Sayeedun Nisa; and Dr. Sharnas Muthu TT, Director-TWEET.

Scheduled for 8–9 October 2025 at Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi, the two-day conclave aims to provide a dynamic platform to celebrate women leaders and strengthen grassroots action. It will bring together women-led organisations, social activists, development professionals, and changemakers from across the country. The event will feature keynote addresses, expert panel discussions, interactive workshops, and networking sessions.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Sharnas highlighted that the conclave aspires to inspire collective action and build collaborations among women-led organisations for meaningful social change.





Bridging Gaps, Building Hope — TWEET's Initiative for Widows in Punjab

The Women Education and Empowerment Trust (TWEET) conducted an Awareness Program on Government Welfare Schemes for widows at Alfalah Public School, Malerkotla, Punjab July 20, 2025. The program was thoughtfully designed to help women access welfare opportunities provided by both government and non-government organizations. Through such initiatives, TWEET aims to empower women, enabling them to overcome socio-economic challenges and enhance their quality of life.



TWEET launches new Adult Literacy Centre at Kanchan Kunj, New Delhi

The Women Education and Empowerment Trust (TWEET) has launched a new Adult Literacy Centre at Kanchan Kunj, New Delhi, on 12 Sept 2025 with the aim of empowering illiterate adults through basic education. The initiative seeks to provide learners with essential reading, writing, and numeracy skills, helping them become functionally literate and self-reliant. The centre also aims to create awareness about the importance of education in improving one's quality of life and fostering community development

ISTC Launches ANM Course at Brijpuri Centre

The Innovation and Skill Training Centre (ISTC) has successfully commenced the Auxiliary Nurse Midwifery (ANM) Course at its Brijpuri Centre with an initial batch of 10 trainees. This milestone reflects ISTC's commitment to bringing professional healthcare education to marginalized communities.

The ANM course aims to prepare skilled healthcare workers capable of providing basic nursing care, maternal and child health services, family welfare, and community health support. With a strong focus on preventive, promotive, curative,

and rehabilitative healthcare, the program equips trainees to serve effectively in both clinical and community settings.

Located in North-East Delhi, Brijpuri is a socioeconomically backward area with limited access to quality education and skill development opportunities. By introducing this course, ISTC seeks to empower local youth, enhance their employability, and strengthen healthcare delivery in underserved regions, thereby contributing to better health outcomes and sustainable community development.



From Goats to Growth: Empowering Women in Behdwa

In Behdwa village of Alirajpur (M.P.), a quiet revolution is taking shape through the Livelihood Project of Model Village Trust, The Goat Rearing Project began with just 12 families, each receiving two goats. The model was simple yet powerful — every year, half of the newborn kids would be shared with another needy family, creating a chain of empowerment.

Today, the initiative has expanded to 20 families, with the goat population growing from 24 to 58, including 21

healthy kids. More than numbers, it has given women a steady source of income, improved nutrition, and renewed confidence. Once confined to household struggles, they are now active contributors to family welfare and children's education.

Behdwa's goat project shows how small steps in livelihood support can spark lasting community transformation — turning goats into growth, and hope into reality.

HWT's Community Kitchen Extends Support to Flood-Affected Families

Following the rise in Yamuna River water levels during September 2025, hundreds of families from low-lying areas of Delhi were displaced and forced to take shelter in temporary camps and roadside settlements. Most of the affected families were daily-wage earners and migrant workers who lost access to regular food and income due to the flooding.

In response to this crisis, Human Welfare Trust had activated its Community Kitchen under Project Ehsas, located near Kalindi Kunj Metro Station. Since early September, the kitchen had been preparing and distributing over 800 freshly cooked meals every day. These meals were served at the relief camp in Sarvodaya Bal Vidyalaya, Madanpur Khadar, and extended to shelter sites across Kanchan Kunj up to Zaitpur.

Human Welfare Trust remains committed to continuing such humanitarian efforts whenever and wherever the need arises, ensuring that no family is left without support in times of crisis.



Balajhor Village Achieves 100% School Enrollment Through Education Awareness and One Teacher School Initiative

In the last quarter, MVT's Education Awareness Campaign in Balajhor Village, Godda, Jharkhand, addressed the village's high dropout rates and low school enrollment of around 60%. Following a detailed survey, a One Teacher School (OTS) was established, providing targeted learning support to out-of-school children. With guidance from

the program team, previously unenrolled children joined Wangam Middle School, while ongoing mentoring helped reduce dropouts from classes 1 to 8. So far, three batches of 30–35 students have successfully completed the OTS program, marking a significant milestone toward quality education for every child in the village.



Empowering Women Through Menstrual Hygiene Awareness in Puri, Odisha

MVT conducted a Menstrual Hygiene Awareness and Counselling Program in Danogahir village, Puri, Odisha, engaging 16 women from Danogahir and 18 from Benapanjiri. Before the intervention, none had access to sanitary pads or knowledge of proper hygiene. Through interactive sessions, participants learned about menstrual health, hygiene, and safe pad usage. As a result, all 34 women have now started using sanitary pads, marking a vital step toward improved menstrual health, dignity, and awareness in their community.







This year marked a remarkable leap in Masawat Livelihood Foundation's journey toward inclusive growth and empowerment.

Through our unique model of interest-free, returnable financial support, we transformed the lives of 13 entrepreneurs across Uttar Pradesh, Assam, Delhi, and West Bengal, extending Rs 2.64 lakh in sustainable livelihood assistance.

The supported trades include materials for jeans manufacturing, medicine, disposable items, raw materials for cleaning products, motor winding supplies, and seven sewing machines. Beyond funding, we nurtured skills through training, market linkages, and women-centric livelihood initiatives.

Affordable Care, Accessible Health: MSS Charitable Clinic Serving the Needy

The Medical Service Society (MSS) Charitable Clinic, located at Radiance Building near Al Shifa Hospital, Jamia Nagar, New Delhi, offers MBBS doctor consultations for just Rs 20 and provides free medicines to those in need. Operating Monday to Friday, 3:00–5:00 PM, the clinic served 466 patients from April to September 2025. Supported by Al Shifa Hospital, this compassionate initiative continues to bridge the healthcare gap for the underprivileged, ensuring affordable and accessible medical care for all.



Standing Strong with Rajasthan's Flood-Hit Families

Heavy floods have severely impacted parts of Sawai Madhopur district in Rajasthan, leaving many families struggling for basic needs. The Society for Bright Future (SBF), in collaboration with partner organizations, immediately launched roundthe-clock relief and rescue operations to support the affected communities.

Under the leadership of State Convener the SBF team has been working tirelessly in Surwal, Dhanauli, and Jadawata villages. Their efforts have so far resulted in the distribution of 576 dry ration kits, with plans to expand relief support in the coming days. During the field visit, the team also engaged with victims, assessed damages, and assured families that they are not alone in this difficult time.



SBF Punjab Flood Relief - Making a Difference

The Society for Bright Future (SBF) actively responded to the devastating floods in Punjab, providing critical relief and support to affected communities. Relief activities covered 16 villages across 5 districts (Buddha Nala, Kapurthala, Firozpur, Gurdaspur, Pathankot), distributing essential supplies including water bottles, ready-to-eat foods, and potassium permanganate. Medical assistance reached families and livestock, benefiting 1,500 recipients. SBF's HQ delegation conducted ground-level surveys, boat assessments, and community meetings, forming the Punjab Flood Relief Committee with local partners to coordinate aid. Immediate consolation support was provided to bereaved families. Rehabilitation surveys are ongoing in Pathankot, ensuring continued assistance for long-term recovery. SBF remains committed to restoring hope and resilience in flood-affected communities.
